












Most populated Cities in the World 2021






How do you get to school - pick all that apply






How long does it take to get to school?




% of registered voters who identify as ...

% of ____residents saying most people who live in different types of communities don't understand the problems they face




Do you know most of your neighbors?






Rural residents are more likely to know most or all neighbors – but not to interact with them

% saying they know all or most of their neighbors




% saying they have face-to-face conversations with any of their neighbors, among those who know at least some of their neighbors
