Over 70 million people are currently displaced because of war, violence, persecution, and human rights violations, with half of this population being young people.

The toll of multi-year conflicts can be seen in such disparate places as Ukraine, Sudan, and Syria. Within the United States, recent polls find that nearly one in four Americans believe that some sort of political violence is necessary to "save" the country. And at the individual level, the anxiety and trauma created by the COVID-19 pandemic continue to challenge the well-being of people across the globe.

The 2025 World Affairs Seminar, Peacebuilding: Creating Lasting Change, will introduce delegates to institutions, people, and ideas that address such challenges as they strive to build a more peaceful world.
